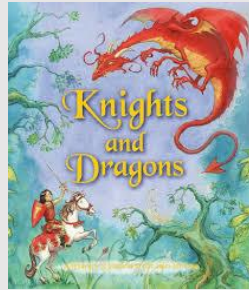

English

In English this term, children will continue to develop their reading, writing, and spoken language skills. They will explore a range of high-quality texts, including stories and information texts. We will focus on sentence structure, punctuation, spelling patterns, and using adventurous vocabulary.



Connected Curriculum

Our connected curriculum links learning across subjects such as Science, History, Geography, Art, and Computing. This helps children make meaningful connections and deepen their understanding of topics. In Summer Term 1 the topic is Knights and Dragons. Maths

In Maths, we will build on the children's understanding of number, calculation, and problem solving. Key areas this term include multiplication and division, fractions, positions and directions and time. Lessons will be practical and engaging, using resources to help children explain their thinking.

- We encourage children to explain their reasoning using mathematical vocabulary.
- A positive attitude to problem solving and trying different strategies is essential.

Expectations:

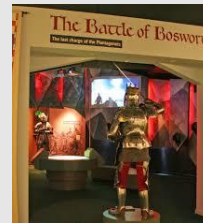
- All uniform items should be clearly labelled.
